Dear Brothers,

In ancient times, as Kings traveled around their empires, they would send a runner ahead proclaiming the coming of the King. It is with that same enthusiasm and sense of urgency that I come to tell you of a truly significant event which is about to occur.

It has now been over twenty years since we purchased our home at 101 N. 16th Street. Like many of us, the house is showing its age; it too is beginning to reveal the effects of all those late nights, parties, and constant use and abuse. We have made many minor repairs over the years. We have replaced the carpets, fixed the shower, repaired the steps and banister, and bought new furniture. But now, the roof leaks, the shower still leaks, and major structural repairs must be undertaken. In addition, we still have an outstanding debt of \$17,000 on our note. We must take steps now if we are to preserve the main structure, or we will have forever lost the opportunity.

We cannot look solely to the active chapter to supply the necessary funds for such a major task. Therefore, the Alumni Association is going to initiate a capital campaign to help retire our existing debt and to provide the funds necessary for capital expenditures on our property. This campaign will begin with a "Phon-a-thon" during the week of March 19th. Sometime during that week, one of your brothers will be contacting you to ask for your help. As alumni, we must commit ourselves to give, and to give generously to help insure a bright future for Zeta Lambda.

As someone once said "Apart from the ballot box, philanthropy presents the one opportunity the individual has to express his meaningful choice over the direction in which our (fraternity) will progress." Please help us to progress as we always have--give so we can go forward!

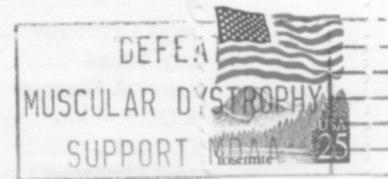
