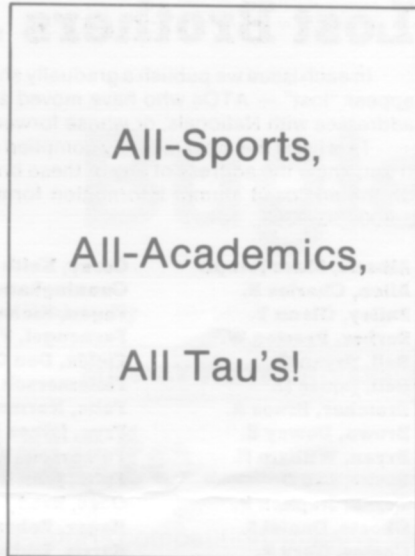
# Sports

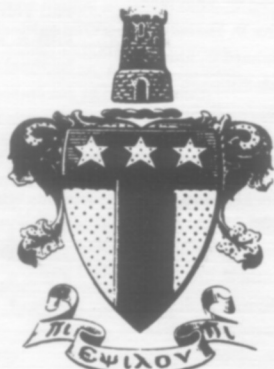
